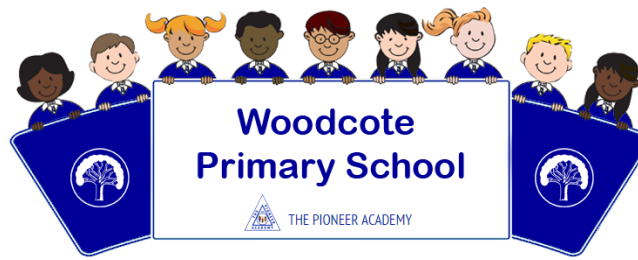


PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Develop friendships with other children
- Invite others into their play and join others in their play
- Start to talk about our emotions
- Continue to understand why we share and take turns
- Settle at an activity for a few minutes
- Continue to manage their own toileting needs including wiping and flushing and washing hands

PHONICS

- Playing alliteration games
- Identifying animals sounds
- Identifying different environmental sounds
- Listening to and trying to identify the first sound in words



PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

- Begin to use a pinching motion
- Use large muscle movements to wave flags, streamers etc
- Balance on one foot
- Develop hand eye coordination
- Balance like a teapot!
- Develop whole hand strength
- Use one hand as a stabiliser and one hand as a manipulating hand

LITERACY

- Enjoy drawing freely
- Recall parts of a story
- Know that the marks we make are of value
- Distinguish between the different marks that we make
- Can copy straight, vertical and horizontal lines
- Imitates adults' writing by making continuous lines of from left to right

Communication and Language

- Start to develop conversation, often jumping from topic to topic
- Show that they understand action words by pointing
- Start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it
- Identify familiar objects and properties when they are described
- Understand simple questions about 'who', 'what' and 'where'
- Understand simple questions and instructions



EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

- Explore different textures
- Join large flat surfaces together
- Hold a paintbrush
- Creates sounds by rubbing, shaking, tapping, striking or blowing
- Adopts roles reflecting own experiences
- Join in singing songs and rhymes
- Taking part in pretend role play with our friends

Maths

- Matching amount to numbers when doing number puzzles
- Playing matching games, based on colours, patterns, size and shape
- Following an abab pattern
- Beginning to write numbers 1 and 2

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

- Talk about what we see using a range of vocabulary
- Begin to understand seasonal change
- Be curious and interested to explore new and familiar experiences in nature
- Know that some characters from stories are from the past
- Shows an interest in lives of people around them
- Talk about different religions
- Talk about differences between materials
