Children's Safety - Pick up

As we continue to ensure our procedures for the end of the day are as safe as possible, we want to remind parents that once your child has been handed over to you by the teacher you are taking responsibility for your child. We do have adults on the gate to supervise and support safety, but please ensure your children stay with you and do not run ahead for example.

If you have given your KS2 child permission to walk to the gate or even walk home, the responsibility is handed to you at the point they leave the classroom. We try our very best to monitor the gates, but we cannot remember all 800+ children's permissions and match with correct adults, so your support and understanding of this is appreciated.

Reception 2025

Do you have a child who turns 5 between Septemebr 2025 and August 2026? If you do, then don't forget the deadline to apply for a Reception place through your own Local Authority closes on 15th January 2025. Any application submitted after this date will be classed as late and the child's application may not be processed until after 16 April 2025.

Birthday Sweets - What are your thoughts? https://forms.gle/NwhRgoRg55ck1a6e6

Birthday Sweets is something we have continued to support at Woodcote, but there is no expectation for this to happen for any family. Our stance has been that if families choose to, then we will allow distribution, but children are told they are not to eat any item until they are with their adult due to dietary and allergy needs.

We have received a proposal for a change to the current tradition of distributing sweets for birthday celebrations with a possible replacement with an alternative celebration, such as a birthday book donation (a single book donated to the class) or other gesture. Some reasons given for this are;

Healthier Alternatives: With increasing concerns over children's health and diet, moving away from sugary treats would contribute to the school's commitment to promoting healthy habits.

Food allergies and sensitivities: Children with allergies may feel left out if the birthday treat is not suitable for them. Parents may also struggle to find treats suitable to cater for the allergies that may be present in a class. In addition, some children may be particularly sensitive to high levels of sugar and additives, resulting in changes in mood and behaviour.

Sibling rivalry: When a child receives a birthday celebration treat, and their sibling doesn't, it can create feelings of unfairness or competition. This feeling of unfairness is exacerbated if one class has more celebrations than the other.

Cost to parents – The cost of sweets compared to a book is likely to be significantly cheaper for families.

Environmental Impact: Reducing the amount of packaging and waste from sweets would be an eco-friendly step for the school, promoting sustainability in everyday practices. It would also reduce littering on and around school grounds from sweet wrappers and packaging.

Encouraging a Love of Reading: By donating a book to the class or school library in honour of a birthday, children would have the opportunity to contribute to the learning environment, enriching the reading material available for others to enjoy.
